

Open Syllables

- Syllables are open when the vowel is long (says its name)
- The vowel is not closed in by a consonant

Marking

- Mark a closed syllable by swooping the syllable, and putting an “o” underneath
- Put a macron above the long vowel

mē
o

rōbōt
o c

- If a one syllable word ends in a **y**, the y makes a **long I** sound, and is considered an open syllable.

shy
o

- If a 2 syllable word ends in a **y**, the y makes a **long E** sound, and is considered an open syllable

pony
o o
